MEET AMONG THE NATION'S TREASURES

For business event planners, Australia's national institutions offer more than striking settings – they deliver immersive, thought-provoking experiences that connect delegates with the Australian story and inspire meaningful conversation.

When approaching the National Gallery of Australia, visitors are immediately drawn to *Ouroboros* – a monumental 13-tonne sculpture by Australian artist Lindy Lee AO, which is set within a 240-square-metre reflecting pool in the Gallery's Sculpture Garden. A walkway leads into the sculpture's 'mouth', where shifting light, shadow and sky play across its perforated, polished and mirrored surface. The work is a major drawcard, captivating guests with its interplay of reflection, movement and form.

Lindy Lee AO explains, 'This work is about the cosmos – the open sky that we all belong to – and when you enter *Ouroboros*, I want you to feel something – a deep connection to something which is much larger than any of us as individuals.'

At the Gallery, you can experience an unforgettable evening of art and fine dining with the Feast of Icons. Begin with drinks and canapés at dusk before a guided visit to *Ouroboros* to explore its cultural connections between Chinese philosophy, First Nations culture and the symbolism of the Rainbow Serpent. As day fades to night, the experience continues at James Turrell's *Within Without Skyspace*, where you can witness how the chamber reframes our perception of the sky. The night concludes with a three-course dinner featuring seasonal local produce and matched wines on the terrace, overlooking the Australian Garden.

These sculptural experiences set the stage for the Gallery's National Sculpture Garden project, due to transform one of Canberra's most significant outdoor spaces into a dynamic venue for cultural and corporate events. Enhanced landscaping, improved accessibility and new integrated art experiences will offer event planners a setting where natural

beauty meets world-class sculpture. Delivered in stages over the coming years, the project honours the Sculpture Garden's original design and heritage while embracing sustainability and First Nations principles.

National Gallery of Australia Director, Dr Nick Mitzevich, comments, 'The National Sculpture Garden is a major part of the National Gallery identity and a treasured site for many of our visitors. We are launching this major project to revitalise and bring the garden into the 21st century.'

A significant addition will be a permanent stainless steel and glass pavilion that will create a new space for exhibitions, events and education programs. A new dining space will open in 2026 within the Gallery foyer, extending to the Australian Garden terrace, while the former dining outlet will become available for hire, providing a new bookable private event space. Trippas White Group, the National Gallery's events and catering partner, can tailor experiences for any event, including exclusive tours for guests to enjoy the collection, exhibitions and the National Sculpture Garden.

From gala dinners amidst iconic works of art to strategy sessions overlooking Parliament House, Canberra's institutions offer an atmosphere of purpose and place found nowhere else. Each provides a unique perspective on the nation – science and innovation at Quesacon, democratic ideals at the Museum of Australian Democracy, cultural storytelling at the National Museum of Australia, and the spirit of achievement at the Australian War Memorial. The National Gallery of Australia presents Australia's artistic story from the world's largest collection of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander art to contemporary works that illuminate how we see and interpret our world today.





CANBERRA INNOVATES

Canberra is Australia's knowledge capital, with unrivalled access to universities, thought leaders and research institutes, serving as a national hub for innovation across diverse sectors.

DEFENCE

Canberra boasts a robust defence network, offering unique proximity to decision-makers, procurement agencies and critical government infrastructure. It's home to the Department of Defence, the historic Royal Military College at Duntroon, the Australian Defence Force Academy, and other key institutions. A skilled workforce develops cutting-edge technologies in intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance.

SPACE AND SPATIAL SCIENCE

Canberra leads Australia's space industry with world-class infrastructure, including NASA's Deep Space Communication Complex and advanced testing for hardware and detectors at Mount Stromlo. UNSW Canberra and the Australian National University (ANU) drive innovation in astronomy and astrophysics, Earth observation, bushfire prediction and climate analytics. The region boasts a mature space ecosystem with expertise in mission assurance, research, training and new technology. Its integration of satellite data into spatial applications positions Canberra as a national hub for space research, knowledge exchange and commercialisation.

CYBERSECURITY AND QUANTUM

Canberra is Australia's cyber and quantum capital – home to national security agencies and the nation's most highly security-cleared workforce. Construction of the new National Security Office Precinct in Barton is underway, reinforcing the city's leadership in this industry. Canberra boasts the highest density of cyber SMEs and prime contractors per capita. Collaborate with world-class researchers, access highly secure data centres and pioneering quantum technology, including room-temperature quantum computing.

AGRI-BUSINESS

Canberra's location and proximity to agricultural land allows the capital to be at the forefront of agri-technology and food science. Our research centres are addressing critical regional, national and global challenges in agri-technology, food technology, environmental sciences and innovation in genetics and phenomics. The Agrifood Innovation Institute bridges the gap between research and industry, addressing global agricultural challenges. Canberra is home to leading bodies like the Grains Research and Development Corporation and the Australian Centre for International Agricultural Research.

RENEWABLE ENERGY

Canberra is a global leader in climate action with 100% renewable electricity and a net-zero emissions target by 2045. The ACT attracts major cleantech investment and supports innovation in EVs, green hydrogen and electrification. With rapid pilot-to-scale capability, top research institutions and nation-leading policies, Canberra is a launch pad for sustainable technologies and a model for carbon-neutral urban development.

ICT AND E-GOVERNMENT


Canberra is a hub for IT providers, benefiting from its advanced broadband infrastructure and proximity to government. Canberra is home to Australia's pre-eminent high-performance data, storage and computing facility and the nation's highest security-rated data centres. Leading education facilities like the ANU, UNSW Canberra and University of Canberra (UC) are all paving the way in skills and research development. Collaboration between multinationals, security agencies and academic institutions fosters a thriving ecosystem for cybersecurity, artificial intelligence, machine learning and digital services.

EDUCATION AND RESEARCH

Canberra is Australia's education and innovation capital. Our education institutions are powered by renowned academics, industry leaders and award-winning thinkers, counting six Nobel Laureates among our university academic staff and alumni. The city hosts globally ranked universities like ANU and UC, alongside research hubs such as the Canberra Innovation Network, which supports startups, entrepreneurs and investors. Construction has recently commenced on the new \$1 billion UNSW Canberra City campus with a plan to welcome students in 2028. This will support industry collaboration in areas such as cybersecurity, defence and artificial intelligence.

TOURISM

Canberra's role as the home of Australia's national attractions and cultural institutions, combined with the city centre's proximity to breathtaking natural landscapes, provides a distinct positioning for visitors. Our progressive environmental agenda ensures lower impact travel with a range of easily accessible experiences. Canberra's diverse tourism region also continues to grow and innovate each year. Australia's 2025 Top Small Tourism Town of Bungendore is only 25 minutes from Canberra's CBD. And as a gateway to the coast, countryside and mountains, Canberra is an ideal base to explore the surrounding region.

HEALTH AND SPORTS SCIENCES

Canberra excels in health and sports sciences. Here, you can access leading experts for your event, like influential scientists from the prestigious John Curtin School of Medical Research at ANU, researchers from the Health Research Institute and the Research Institute of Sport and Exercise at the UC Hospital, or athletes and leaders in sports innovation from the Australian Institute of Sport (AIS). In January 2026, the new Australian Centre for Disease Control legally became an independent agency – located in Canberra.

A CITY OF KNOWLEDGE

Canberra is Australia's knowledge capital, connecting world-class universities, research institutes and thought leaders across multiple sectors. It is a national hub for defence, space, cybersecurity, agri-technology, renewable energy, ICT, education, health and sports sciences. Key institutions include the Department of Defence, UNSW Canberra, ANU, UC and the Australian Institute of Sport.

Canberra drives innovation in space exploration, quantum computing, sustainable technologies, agriculture, digital services and biomedical research. The Research and Learning Institutes Group (RALIG) allows event planners to access the extraordinary knowledge and expertise of Canberra's thought leaders. (refer to page 20 for more information).

A CITY OF CULTURE

Canberra is a hub for culture and the arts. Here you'll find the country's major cultural institutions which are always expanding and evolving, like the National Gallery of Australia, Australian War Memorial, the National Museum of Australia, the National Film and Sound Archives and the National Portrait Gallery.

The institutions not only tell the Australian story and house rare artworks and artefacts, but also serve as unique function venues, for events large and small. The ACT also boasts a rich calendar of events, from Enlighten and Floriade, to live sport, music, and festivals.

A CITY OF INFLUENCE

As the home of Australian Parliament House and the Federal Parliament Press Gallery, Canberra also allows unrivalled access to key government decision makers and the country's most prominent media outlets.

On a territory level, the ACT Government is regarded as one of the most progressive in the country, leading the way in initiatives like same-sex marriage, drug decriminalisation legislation, and the wellbeing indicator framework. All the ACT's electricity comes from renewable sources, and the territory is committed to achieving net-zero emissions by 2045.



A GREENER DESTINATION



When you hold your business event in Canberra, you are also showcasing your commitment to a more sustainable future. The nation's capital is not only a highly liveable city, it is globally recognised as one of the most sustainable in the world. The Australian Capital Territory (ACT) continues to deliver one of the most ambitious climate action agendas in the world. Here are just some of the ways Canberra is contributing to a future that's genuinely sustainable.

TAP INTO OUR ENERGY

Since 2020, the ACT has been powered entirely by renewable electricity generated from wind and solar sources, making it the first city outside Europe – and the eighth in the world – to achieve this milestone. The ACT is also aiming to achieve net-zero emissions by 2045. Canberra boasts Australia's first testing facility for replacing natural gas with hydrogen and is home to the country's largest community-owned solar farm. The Big Canberra Battery project will enhance energy security across the electricity grid. This includes installing solar batteries in multiple government buildings, three community batteries across the ACT, and constructing a grid-scale battery with a capacity of 500 MWh, enough to power 23,400 households on a single charge.

WATCH THIS GREEN SPACE

Canberra is a modern, well-planned and green city, with nature never too far away. In fact, you'll find around 70% of the Territory is open space, parkland or nature reserve. And don't be surprised to see some of the native wildlife right in the heart of town.

GETTING AROUND

A smaller and well-connected city means it's easy to get around. The expanding light rail network is completely powered by renewable electricity. Canberra has one of the largest electric bus depots, supporting over 100 buses. The extensive bike path network makes it easy to reduce your carbon footprint using electric scooters and bikes or taking a walk. Canberra also has the highest number of electric vehicle charge stations per capita in Australia and was the first to have a public green hydrogen refuelling station for hydrogen vehicles.

OUR CLEAN AIR

Situated at a higher altitude near the mountains, Canberra benefits from cleaner air due to improved circulation and minimal pollution. As a meticulously planned city with more green spaces than concrete developments, it boasts air quality that is well above average for a capital city. Local government provides incentives to residents to further reduce air pollution by replacing wood heaters with electric and legislating against gas appliances in new builds.

WASTE NOT


Canberra is aiming to become a circular city and is upgrading infrastructure to sort and process everything from food scraps to construction waste. Unnecessary single-use plastics are being phased out, and the Container Deposit Scheme (for cans and bottles) is being expanded.

GREEN CONFERENCING AND EVENTS

Canberra is well set up and experienced in running events with a reduced carbon footprint. If arriving by air, you'll land at the award-winning Canberra International Airport, one of the first in the world to install tri-generation plants, cutting carbon emissions by 75%. Local government provides incentives for sustainable practices through initiatives like the Sustainable Event program, which helps organisers reduce waste by providing free signage, equipment and advice. Canberra is home to many academic and innovative institutions that can provide your conference with speakers and experts on sustainability.

SUSTAINABILITY CERTIFICATION

In Australia, sustainability certification options for the tourism industry include programs such as Ecotourism Australia's ECO Certification and EarthCheck Certified, which assess environmental, cultural and operational sustainability practices to promote eco-friendly tourism.

It has been estimated that one in five people have accessibility needs, so we understand how important it is to consider accessibility when planning an event.

Canberra is a thoughtfully planned city with a variety of highly accessible venues. With minimal traffic issues, wide streets, transit lanes, bike paths and its iconic roundabouts, it's an easy place to navigate. Many venues, such as Australia's national institutions, are designed with features like ramps, wider parking spaces, audio tours and braille pads, ensuring they are accessible for people with limited mobility, as well as those with sight or hearing impairments.

For some interesting experiences, there is wheelchair basketball at the Australian Institute of Sport (AIS), the sparkling interaction of Questacon and the delightful sights, smells and sounds of the National Zoo and Aquarium and the Australian National Botanic Gardens. Tours can be tailored specifically to the needs of groups or individuals, with various mobility vehicles available for hire at each venue.

Through the Australian Tourism Industry Council (ATIC), the Accessible Tourism program provides certification to tourism businesses that meet criteria for supporting low vision, wheelchairs and scooters, low hearing, limited mobility, and cognitive or autism-related needs.

WHAT'S NEW IN THE CAPITAL?

Canberra continues to evolve as Australia's 'meeting place', offering a wealth of new spaces, experiences and developing infrastructure that make it an ideal destination for business events.

VENUE HIGHLIGHTS

A host of exciting new venues and redevelopments are reshaping Canberra's event landscape. The Crystalbrook Aurora is progressing, promising responsible lux accommodation and conference spaces, available from early 2027. The Canberra Theatre Centre is expanding with a new Lyric Theatre, while the National Gallery of Australia is refreshing its National Sculpture Garden. The Australian War Memorial's Anzac Hall is reopening, University House has been lovingly restored, and both Shaw Estate and Pialligo Estate have new offerings for memorable gatherings.

INFRASTRUCTURE ON THE MOVE


Canberra's infrastructure continues to advance with key projects that enhance accessibility and amenity, as well as revitalising the city centre and connecting the city to the lake. Acton Waterfront is underway and will offer a new lakeside destination. Light Rail Stage 2A and 2B are set to connect more of the city, while the UNSW Canberra campus is now under construction and will inject vibrancy into the south.

EXPANDING HORIZONS

New aviation connections are open with Qatar Airways offering daily flights to Canberra via Melbourne from Doha in the Middle East. More domestic direct flights are available from Canberra to Avalon and Coffs Harbour. Lake Burley Griffin features the newly renovated Love Boat functions vessel with flexible boarding locations. There's now even a floating sauna for a unique wellness option.

IMMERSIVE EXPERIENCES


Canberra's attractions are embracing interactivity, with national institutions like the Royal Australian Mint offering immersive displays and behind-the-scenes tours. Adventure seekers can enjoy the expanded Treetops Adventure park or the Majura Valley Sunflower Maze. The city's growing calendar of exhibitions, sporting events and festivals are even more reasons to visit, while new environmental, social and governance (ESG) aligned experiences from supporting Hands Across Canberra to conservation focused tours with Wildbark, offer meaningful ways to give back.



GETTING HERE

Canberra is under an hour by air from Sydney, one hour from Melbourne and less than two hours from Brisbane.

Canberra Airport is a 10-minute drive from the CBD, with easy access to the city by rental car, limousine, public transport, shuttle bus, taxi or rideshare.



DOMESTIC FLIGHTS

Qantas, Virgin Australia, Jetstar, Link Airways and FlyPelican offer direct flights to 12 domestic destinations, including regional hubs like Cairns, Newcastle and Hobart, as well as all state capitals and major Australian cities. Canberra's strong connectivity provides convenient access for delegates from both regional centres and capital cities.

INTERNATIONAL FLIGHTS

Qatar Airways flies daily to Doha from Canberra, offering travellers access to more than 170 destinations across the

Qatar Airways global network. Fly direct to Nadi, Fiji, with Fiji Airways, with further connections to the United States, Canada and beyond.

LAND TRANSPORT

Direct rail and coach services to Canberra are alternatives for delegates from Sydney or the South Coast. Transport NSW runs rail services daily to Canberra from Sydney, while several coach companies – Murrays, Greyhound and FlixBus – provide frequent trips on the same route, with Murrays also servicing Narooma and Wollongong. For those preferring to drive, national freeways make Canberra an easy three-hour journey from Sydney.

Canberra is the capital of Australia. It is situated within the Australian Capital Territory (ACT), located inland between Sydney and Melbourne, and surrounded by the state of New South Wales (NSW).

TIME ZONE

Canberra's time zone is Australian Eastern Standard Time (GMT plus 10 hours), the same as Sydney and Melbourne.

Canberra has four distinct seasons, with the environment changing as the seasons do. All year round, Canberra is loved for its clean air, stunning sunsets and beautiful nature. Seasonal temperatures in Celsius are:

GOODS AND SERVICES TAX (GST)

Australia has a Goods and Services Tax (GST) of 10% on most goods and services. It is included in the advertised price rather than being added on when you pay.

VISAS AND ELECTRONIC TRAVEL AUTHORITY

All international visitors to Australia, except New Zealand travellers, require a visa to travel to and enter Australia. They must apply for their visa prior to entering Australia.

The most common visa for business purposes is the Electronic Travel Authority (ETA) for Business Visitors, valid for visits up to three months. It can be obtained for entry to Australia using the ETA app.

A range of markets operate in Canberra, including Capital Region Farmers Market, Old Bus Depot Markets and the quarterly Handmade Market, as well as alternatives such as the Little Burley Markets on the shores of Lake Burley Griffin and Haig Park Markets in Braddon. Stallholders at these markets sell a wide variety of produce and artisanal fare from local makers, farmers and growers, and present a lovely option for a special range of Canberra gifts and souvenirs.

Supermarkets and large retailers are often open longer hours. Stores may also be open longer in the lead up to special occasions such as Christmas.

CANBERRA AND REGION VISITORS CENTRE

Located at Regatta Point on the shores of Lake Burley Griffin, the award-winning Canberra and Region Visitors Centre offers assistance with a range of questions and the friendly staff can help you find entertainment, accommodation or restaurant options. If you have time for shopping, don't miss the unique Canberra region food, wine and gifts stocked at the centre.

NATIONAL CAPITAL EXHIBITION

Co-located with the Canberra and Region Visitors Centre, the National Capital Exhibition tells the story of Canberra as the capital city of Australia. The multi-media exhibition shares the town planning vision of Walter and Marion Burley Griffin, who created a city unique in design, combining seamlessly the city's infrastructure with the surrounding natural landscapes.

Open Monday to Friday 9 am to 5 pm and weekends 10 am to 4 pm, closed Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

GETTING AROUND

Getting around Canberra is quick, easy and congestion-free. With great roads, abundant walking and bike paths, and reliable public transport, locals and visitors alike praise Canberra for its accessibility and ease of navigation. You can simply fit more in the day when you do business in Canberra.

BUSES

Transport Canberra's bus service offers a zero-emission electric bus fleet that will continue to expand throughout 2026 as part of a frequent and reliable bus network connecting you to all major routes within the city. Bus Route 3 connects the city to the airport with a service approximately every 15 minutes. The Explorer Bus offers a hop-on hop-off service, departing from the city and taking passengers to Canberra's major attractions.

LIGHT RAIL

Supporting Canberra's goal of a zero-emissions future, the light rail connects you from North Canberra to the CBD with a fast, frequent and comfortable journey along Northbourne Avenue. Construction of Stage 2 is underway, extending the line to Commonwealth Park, with plans to eventually connect to Woden and South Canberra.

TAXIS AND RIDESHARE

Canberra is well-serviced by taxis and other rideshare providers like DiDi and Uber.

RENTAL CARS

All major rental car companies have branches in Canberra and at Canberra Airport, allowing for easy pick-up and drop-off.

E-SCOOTERS

E-scooters in Canberra offer another convenient option for short trips around the city and across the lake. The devices are app-operated and available for use through the city and now allow users to scooter between suburbs.

WALK OR BIKE

The multiple pedestrian and bike paths paving the city make it a breeze to get active as you get around Canberra. Most hotels offer bike hire and Canberra has many scenic routes through parks and around lakes and suburbs making it one of Australia's most bike- and pedestrian-friendly cities.

SELF-DRIVE

With Canberra's proximity to Sydney and larger regional centres of NSW, delegates can easily take the self-drive option for getting here and for moving around within Canberra.

For electric vehicle (EV) drivers, Canberra has over 180 charge stations. In fact, the ACT has the highest concentration of stations per kilometre in Australia and has seen significant expansion in the surrounding region as well.



CBD AND NEWACTON


Whether it's catching a show at Canberra Theatre Centre or lacing up for a game at Kingpin Canberra, it's easy to explore Canberra's city centre on foot. The historic Sydney and Melbourne buildings are alive with dining and bar options, with plenty of shopping and entertainment on offer nearby. Venture a few minutes west and you'll find the hotels, eateries, art and architecture of the NewActon precinct.

**BRADDON**

Right on the edge of the CBD, Braddon is the place to go for hip cafes, a range of dining options, lively bars and boutique shops. Try a cosy tipple at Midnight Bar, smooth bourbons combining the American south-west with Canberra charm at Peacemaker Saloon, or a sleek Asian-style BBQ at Wilma.

**NATIONAL TRIANGLE**

Discover Canberra's National Triangle, where the iconic Australian Parliament House is the centrepiece. Visitors can also enjoy the nation's popular museums, galleries and major institutions, admiring the distinctive architecture before indulging in exceptional dining experiences. All just steps from Lake Burley Griffin and nearby hotels.

**KINGSTON AND MANUKA**


These inner south precincts feature established trees and beautiful older buildings which sit harmoniously alongside modern precincts. Catch a match at Corroboree Group Oval Manuka, followed by a meal in Barton or Kingston. **WODEN AND TUGGERANONG**

BELCONNEN

Just 10 minutes north-west of the city, Belconnen is home to the University of Canberra, GIO Stadium and the Australian Institute of Sport. Rooftop conference venue 59 Cameron Avenue offers sweeping views of Black Mountain and Lake Ginninderra with nearby options to shop, eat or enjoy the exciting arts program at Belconnen Arts Centre situated on the lakefront.

**GUNGAHLIN**

Gungahlin is the newest precinct in Canberra and the furthest north of the town centres. It is the home of Wildbark visitor centre and the Mulligans Flat Woodland Sanctuary, nurturing rare wildlife back from near extinction. Close by is Petrichor Farm, a picturesque, heritage-restored venue offering farm tours and rustic Australiana events.

DAIRY ROAD AND FYSHWICK

Just 15 minutes from the CBD is the Dairy Road precinct offering an industrial vibe. A brewery, coffee roasters, a theatre, a distillery and yoga studios are set in a contemporary restyled warehouse. Contentious Character's urban winery is a must-visit for a local wine. Close by is the industrial area of Fyshwick – fast evolving into a more creative and mixed-use destination and home of popular food markets, eateries and coffee shops.

**LANYON HOMESTEAD**

Ten minutes south of the CBD, the town centre of Woden has been revitalised in recent years, with more residential apartments, health services and offices, an enhanced shopping centre and more dining options. There are plenty of delicious spots to eat and drink along Bradley Street, including The Alby and Space Kitchen. Head further south to Tuggeranong for the historical venue of Lanyon Homestead, koalas at Tidbinbilla Nature Reserve and Corin Forest for winter snow play.

CANBERRA THROUGH THE SEASONS

From the red and amber leaves that blanket the city in autumn, to the bright pops of colour as the blooms emerge in spring, Canberra enjoys four distinct seasons. And no matter when you visit, there's always something wonderful to discover.



AUTUMN

As the leaves turn and the temperature drops, Canberra's mountain range, lake and expansive nature reserves provide a spectacular backdrop to immerse oneself in autumn. The city rises early and looks to the skies for the Canberra Balloon Spectacular and then stays up late to watch the national institutions illuminated for Enlighten.

Autumn is the perfect time to visit one of Canberra region's 140 cool climate vineyards, either just for a taste to discover a new favourite, or to indulge in one of the winery restaurants where you can settle in for a feast of local produce.

WINTER

While the mornings may be frosty, winter in Canberra tends to have crystal clear skies and beautiful days. Head to the National Arboretum Canberra for spectacular views and explore forest trees wrapped in bright scarves for the season. Watch a game of rugby or NRL, browse an art exhibition or head to the Canberra Glassworks to observe or try glassblowing.

You can also indulge at the Truffle Festival – either enjoy the tasty morsels in dishes around town or head to a nearby truffle farm and follow a truffle dog on a hunt. For some snow play, Corin Forest is only a one-hour drive from Canberra.

SPRING

When spring has sprung, the place to be in Canberra is Commonwealth Park, where more than one million flowers bloom in unison for the month-long Floriade, Australia's biggest celebration of spring.

With the weather warming up, it's a great time to get outdoors. Take your picnic out to Lake Burley Griffin with a self-drive Love Boat or slow things down by renting a pedal boat followed by lunch with a view at The Marion. Simply take a walk around the lake or drive out to the ACT's picturesque national parks for many hiking opportunities.

SUMMER

The summer months in Canberra are best enjoyed outdoors, whether it's watching the cricket at Corroboree Group Oval Manuka, getting amongst it at the various festivals and events or enjoying the long days and balmy conditions at an outdoor bar or restaurant.

The temperatures tend to stay quite pleasant, but if you're looking to cool down, the national institutions and art galleries always have an exciting program this time of year. After taking in an exhibition or at the end of a conference day, why not wind down lakeside at The Jetty or The Boathouse.

INDIGENOUS CULTURE

Canberra is on Ngunnawal country and has been home to the Ngunnawal, Ngunawal and Ngambri peoples for over 25,000 years. Our city's name 'Canberra' is thought to be derived from the Ngunnawal word for 'meeting place'. As such, there are a wide variety of Indigenous experiences for your delegates to connect with, learn from and participate in.

Aboriginal Tent Embassy

Founded on Australia Day 1972, the Aboriginal Tent Embassy is permanently established on the lawns outside Old Parliament House (now the Museum of Australian Democracy) and has come to represent Indigenous Australians' quest for sovereignty and right to self-determination.

Australian Parliament House

Join the 'Yeribee' Indigenous experiences tour to hear the stories of Indigenous parliamentarians and appreciate significant artworks from the Parliament House Art Collection by celebrated Indigenous artists.

Dhawura Aboriginal Cultural Tours

Travel back in time to become part of 'The Dreaming' and gain a deep understanding of Aboriginal culture. Join an experienced Aboriginal guide at various sites of significance in and around Canberra.

Museum of Australian Democracy

Follow the journey of First Nation Australians in their search for equality. Learn about the Wiradjuri elders who travelled 150 kilometres to attend the opening of Old Parliament House, the activists who have campaigned for a voice in Federal Parliament, and the accomplishments of Neville Bonner, the first Aboriginal Australian to be elected to parliament.

National Arboretum Canberra

Take a seat in The Mununja Garden, shaped in a butterfly form, that tells a Dreamtime story from the Ngunnawal people passed through generations for thousands of years.

National Gallery of Australia

Immerse yourself in the largest and most comprehensive First Nations Art Collection in the world. The first new exhibition in 2026 is the 5th National Indigenous Art Triennial: After the Rain – bringing together commissioned work by established and emerging First Nations artists from across Australia. Take a tour and learn more about the story of Australia's first people through art and artefacts.

National Museum of Australia

First Australians and Talking Blak to History are permanent exhibition galleries that explore the shared stories and experiences of Australia's First Nations Peoples. The daily First Australians Tour presents the history, culture and connection to Country for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

National Triangle

Take a self-guided tour through the artwork at Reconciliation Place. Located in the heart of the National Triangle, these artworks symbolically and physically place Reconciliation at the heart of the nation.

Traditional Owners Aboriginal Corporation

Organise a bespoke cultural education session for your group to learn about the land and its ancient history, share traditional food and talk about life for Indigenous people in Australia today.

CULTURE AND THE AUSTRALIAN STORY

Canberra's museums, galleries and institutions showcase diverse aspects of the nation's story through architecture, exhibitions and collections.



AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL BOTANIC GARDENS**Clunies Ross Street, Acton**

Only minutes from the centre of Canberra is the world's most diverse collection of Australian plants – more than 4,300 different species. The Living Plant collection is centered on 'themes' and are grouped by geographic origins ranging from the rainforests of the coast to the iconic landscapes of Australia's Red Centre. Take a guided tour, have a picnic, attend a workshop, birdwatch in a treehouse and immerse yourself in Australia's nature.

Watch Parliament live during sitting weeks and visit public galleries during Question Time.

Step inside and explore new exhibitions* highlighting personal stories from the last 30 years of Australia's service in the Middle East, Afghanistan, and peacekeeping missions. Experience previously unseen collection objects that uncover fresh perspectives on how war shapes lives, communities and our shared humanity. Revisit earlier chapters of Australia's military story in the First World War, Second World War, Vietnam and Cold War era galleries. Each day, the Last Post Ceremony invites a moment to pause and remember lives lost across generations.



Major exhibitions for 2026 include the National Indigenous Art Triennial: After the rain, Ngura Pulka – Epic Country, Arthur Boyd: tapestries and Full Throttle.

EAT AND DRINK

With more restaurants per capita than any other Australian city, Canberra offers a vibrant foodie scene shaped by its cosmopolitan and eclectic tastes. Explore everything from inner-city hawker markets to fine dining among the lions or high tea overlooking the lake. Whether it's a chef-hatted experience, hors d'oeuvres after a truffle hunt, or a feast following a life-size art immersion, Canberra serves something for every palate.

WHAT'S NEW IN DINING

Azuma Den now brings contemporary Asian cuisine to **East Hotel**, adding a new dimension to its traditionally Italian dining line-up. **Tintino** in Kingston blends a wine bar, small eats and high-end bottle shop experience, and **Vice** in the heart of the CBD caters for gourmet meat lovers with a slightly holy ambience. **Johnny Gio's Pizza** is now open in the bustling eatery area of Braddon, bringing New York-style authentic Italian flavours to add to the mix of options.

DINING WITH A TWIST

Water's Edge provides exclusive outdoor domes for shared meals in your own bubble overlooking Lake Burley Griffin. **Beltana Farm** hosts truffle-hunting adventures paired with farm-to-table meals. **Tiger Lane** in the Canberra Centre is a hawker-style Asian food hall and **Verity Lane Market** is an urban space for hire with market-style food and beverage vendors. The **National Gallery of Australia** presents 'Feast of Icons', combining immersive art and culinary creativity. For extra thrill, the multi-award-winning **Jamala Wildlife Lodge** lets guests dine beside white lions or playful hyenas, separated only by a (strong) pane of glass.

WATERFRONT FEASTING

Waterside venue options include **The Boat House**, **The Marion**, **The Jetty** and the **Canberra Southern Cross Club Yacht Club**, all featuring lake views and alfresco areas. Kingston Foreshore's **The Dock** or **Walt & Burley** offer a deck feel for casual drinks with a view. **Red Shed**, a community rowing facility, doubles as a venue with a view and café as well as a team-building destination. **National Museum of Australia**'s outdoor amphitheatre and lakeside deck sit on its own peninsula, while the **Belconnen Arts Centre** is a space with a creative vibe next to Lake Ginninderra.

BEVERAGES AND BREWERIES

Pialligo Estate plans to open a modern cellar door, while the newly renovated **Shaw Estate** is a direct bus ride from **Hotel Realm**. Breweries include **Bentspoke**, known for its award-winning Crankshaft beer and **Capital Brewing** with a popular beer garden. **The Canberra Distillery** offers the perfect souvenir for speaker gifts and **Underground Spirits** creates a unique twist with hot cocktails and creative packaging. The **Muk Bar** in Barton offers liquor and Korean food pairing with a modern twist. Coffee highlights are the internationally award-winning **ONA Coffee House** and roastery, and the sustainably driven **Two Before Ten** cafés across the city.

Visitors can enjoy immersive experiences such as the National Gallery of Australia's 'Feast of Icons', where sculpture and storytelling collide, or feel the emotional resonance of The Last Post ceremony at the Australian War Memorial. Try one of the Indigenous experiences at the National Arboretum Canberra or opt for an intimate floor talk with a curator at the National Portrait Gallery.

FRESH PERSPECTIVES

Gain a fresh vantage point on the capital with experiences that lift spirits and perspectives. Float over Lake Burley Griffin at sunrise in a hot air balloon or visit during the Canberra Balloon Spectacular for a breathtaking display. Try kite making and fly your creation at the National Arboretum Canberra or stargaze with expert guides at Mount Stromlo Observatory. See panoramic views and spectacular photo moments from Mount Ainslie, Red Hill and the Lake George escarpment or experience treetop birdwatching at the Australian National Botanic Gardens with its elevated nature encounter.

Delegates can dress up and explore political storytelling at the Museum of Australian Democracy, then deepen understanding of women in politics with a tailored She Shapes History tour – an experience that's insightful, lively and genuinely memorable.

CULINARY ENCOUNTERS

The Canberra region is a haven for food lovers, offering premium produce, boutique makers and memorable culinary encounters. Delegates can tour more than 40 cool climate wineries in the region, savour truffles freshly hunted just minutes from the CBD or enjoy behind-the-scenes access at Parliament House with a chef-led soufflé demonstration. Hands-on options include gnocchi-making workshops as well as cellar-door tastings at Pialligo Estate and Contentious Character, only minutes from the CBD. Add distillery tours or cocktail classes to elevate networking opportunities with flavour and flair.

MOVE AND RESTORE

Canberra's natural landscape encourages fresh air activity and invigorating movement. With more than 20 scenic walks and trails, delegates can enjoy outdoor time that suits all fitness levels. Join a charity run around Lake Burley Griffin, hit championship golf courses at Royal Canberra or Federal Golf Club accompanied by grazing kangaroos, or head less than an hour out of town for snow play in winter.

AUSTRALIAN WILDLIFE CLOSE-UP

Canberra offers unforgettable wildlife moments that bring delegates closer to Australia's unique fauna. Visit the National Zoo & Aquarium for private tours or animal encounters or explore Wildbark for twilight adventures and close-up learning. Join Canberra Guided Tours at Tidbinbilla to meet kangaroos and koalas in their natural habitats. Even within the city, kangaroos graze in parks, and cockatoos and rosellas fill the skyline, creating an accessible and authentic wildlife experience that feels both distinctly Australian and wonderfully personal.

LAKESIDE AND WATER ACTIVITIES

From tranquil lake moments to invigorating group challenges, Canberra's waterways deliver variety and fun. Delegates can take a self-drive Love Boat from the Kingston Foreshore, enjoy a scenic cruise or simply watch the water action from The Marion. For team building, the Red Shed offers rowing experiences, while inflatables and saunas on the lake provide a fun and picturesque way to unwind. Fun of the frozen-water kind can be found at Corin Forest in Canberra's local hills, where delegates can be introduced to their first taste of snow for a ski or toboggan ride.

The National Gallery of Australia's Art for Wellbeing program offers a calming, reflective environment to explore creativity and mindfulness.

ITINERARY IDEAS

SAMPLE CONFERENCE PROGRAM 4 days | 1,000 delegates

Offering an impressive array of national attractions, dining and entertainment options, outdoor adventure and vibrant precincts, your group will marvel at the richness of Australian capital experiences. Here's a sample of how you could frame your conference itinerary in Canberra.

DAY 1

Delegates fly into **Canberra Airport** and, after a short 10-minute drive into the city, check into their CBD hotel.

After registering at the **National Convention Centre Canberra**, delegates enjoy some free time with a relaxing stroll or e-scooter ride 'bridge to bridge' around Lake Burley Griffin before the evening welcome cocktail reception in the Great Hall at **Australian Parliament House** – one of the few parliaments in the world to offer such exclusive access. Ngunnawal Elders lead a powerful Welcome to Country, recognising Canberra's significance as the 'meeting place'.



DAY 2

Delegates walk the short distance to the **National Convention Centre Canberra** for a day of conferencing. Content for the day can be enriched with speakers including parliamentarians, ministers, sector experts and thought leaders from government and five leading universities, including the highly ranked **Australian National University**.

Accompanying partners begin the day with breakfast at one of the many cafés lining Lonsdale Street in Braddon, and go on to explore the city and its cultural icons with a:

- visit to an exhibition at the **Australian War Memorial**, **National Gallery of Australia** or **National Museum of Australia**
- behind-the-scenes tour of **Australian Parliament House**
- **Love Boats** ride on Lake Burley Griffin
- wild animal encounter at the **National Zoo & Aquarium**.

A free night means delegates can explore the city precincts and laneways, stopping for drinks at **Bar Rochford**, **Wilma** or **King O'Malley's Irish Pub**. Dinner could be in one of Canberra's many fine dining inner-city establishments, such as **Raku**, **Inka**, **Such and Such** or **Koto**, or in a more casual setting at **Verity Lane**, **Akiba** or **Johnny Gio's Pizza**.

DAY 3

Delegates wake early for a brisk walk up Mount Ainslie, delivering unparalleled views of the city, before heading to the conference venue for a day of sessions and the trade exhibition. The morning session is led by **Hands Across Canberra** where speaker gifts are coordinated by a local charity to leave lasting benefit for those in need.

Partners have the option to:

- tour some of the 40 winery cellar doors all within a 35-minute drive from Canberra
- head to **Tidbinbilla Nature Reserve** to learn the Indigenous history of the area, while immersing themselves in the native flora and fauna – they will likely see kangaroos, koalas and emus.

Tonight's gala dinner is held at the **National Arboretum Canberra**, starting with drinks on the balcony at sunset, taking in the expansive views, followed by an exceptional paddock-to-plate dinner. A dance floor awaits those ready to let their hair down.



DAY 4

Delegates attend the final session of the conference, which concludes at midday. They can then enjoy a round of golf at **Federal Golf Club**, a relaxing wellness treatment at **Hale Spa**, or a well-deserved drink at a local brewery such as **Bentspoke** or head to a more intimate wine bar such as **Tintino**. Afterwards, delegates head home via **Canberra Airport** – a lower carbon, 'greener' airport.

Hosting an event in Canberra offers delegates access to the award-winning Canberra District Wine Region, the pristine Alpine countryside, the South Coast's stunning beaches and fresh seafood, the magic of the Australian national parks and the rural charm of the Southern Tablelands.

COOL CLIMATE WINE REGION

Decades ago, scientists planted the first vines near Canberra. Today, the Canberra District Wine Region boasts 140 vineyards, over 40 boutique cellar doors, and a reputation for exceptional cool climate wines. The region's standout varietals are shiraz and riesling, with distinctive blends to explore.

Hotel Realm offers bus rides to Shaw Estate in Murrumbateman for a wine tasting and dining experience overlooking the views of the vineyards.

ALPINE ADVENTURES

In just under an hour's drive from Canberra, Corin Forest offers snow play, an alpine slide and ski or snowboard lessons. And just two-and-a-half hours south of Canberra lies Australia's Alpine region, perfect for snow enthusiasts. Ski or snowboard at Perisher, Thredbo, Guthega, Charlotte Pass, or family-friendly Selwyn Snow Resort. Thredbo Alpine Hotel offers function spaces and accommodation with stunning mountain views. When the snow melts, enjoy world-class mountain biking, fishing in clear streams or horseback rides through pristine bushland. Hike to Mount Kosciuszko's peak, hunt for wildflowers or relax at the Yarrangobilly thermal pools.

SOUTH COAST

Take a step back from a busy conference program with a trip to the south coast, just two hours' drive from Canberra. Stretching from Jervis Bay (which is actually part of the ACT) right down the Sapphire Coast is a region of unspoilt coastline, and an undeniably relaxed pace. The coastal entry point for most Canberrans is Batemans Bay where visitors can indulge in fresh, local oysters, meander through historic villages,

swim at white sandy beaches, whale watch from the shore, and experience Indigenous culture. For a conference venue with a difference, the architecturally designed Willinga Park at Bawley Point offers sophisticated spaces and high-spec accommodation. The South Coast area boasts more than 30 national parks, as well as marine and nature reserves for an idyllic opportunity to reconnect with nature.

NATIONAL PARKS AND NATURE RESERVES

Canberra is known as the 'bush capital' for a reason – no matter where you are, green spaces or nature reserves are never far away. Close to town, a short but heart-pumping hike up Mount Ainslie or Black Mountain will reward you with panoramic views over the capital in every direction. A bit further afield, Namadgi National Park and Tidbinbilla Nature Reserve offer spots for walking, biking, fishing, animal spotting or exploring archaeological sites dating back over 21,000 years.

SOUTHERN TABLELANDS

Just a short drive from Canberra City, discover charming country towns rich in history. Yass and Bungendore – Australia's Top Small Tourist Town 2025 – are ideal for shopping for local crafts, exploring art or indulging in homemade treats. A stop at Jugiong calls for lunch at The Sir George and a shop at The Long Track Pantry, or for something sweet, head to the Murrumbateman Chocolate Company. Take a short drive to Sutton on the outskirts of Canberra for a freshly baked pastry from Little Sutton Bakehouse or step back in time in Braidwood. Take a moment to marvel at the ancient 400-million-year-old rock formations of Wombeyan Caves.

CAPACITY TABLE
